Investigating campus antisemitism

AMCHA Initiative's research arm carries out systematic, in-depth research and analysis of antisemitic activity and has developed a comprehensive method for defining, documenting, and analyzing manifestations of antisemitic behavior on campus, as well as the institutional structures that legitimize it and allow it to flourish.

In 2014, AMCHA's investigative techniques were evidenced in its comprehensive three-year *Antisemitic Activity and Anti-Israel Bias at the Center for Near East Studies at University of California 2010-2013* report, as well as in a book chapter written by AMCHA co-founder Tammi Rossman-Benjamin, which explored the research activities of faculty boycotters and the impact of their advocacy of BDS on their campuses.

Investigating campus antisemitism

3-Year Comprehensive AMCHA Initiative Study on UCLA's CNES Released

The 102-page Antisemitic Activity and Anti-Israel Bias at the Center for Near East Studies, University of California Los Angeles 2010-2013 report tracked antisemitic discourse and anti-Israel bias in public events sponsored by UCLA's Center for Near East Studies (CNES) over a three-year period, from 2010 – 2013.


Findings include:

- 93% of the Israel-related events were anti-Israel
- 75% of the Israel-related events displayed antisemitic discourse
- 61% of all events pertaining to significant Middle East conflicts pertained to Israel
- 84% of speakers at Israel events had engaged in antisemitic activity prior to CNES
- 100% of the CNES directors had engaged in anti-Israel and antisemitic activity

Investigating campus antisemitism

Research on Faculty Boycotters Revealed in a Book Chapter Written by AMCHA Co-Founder

- Of the 938 boycotting faculty:
 - ➤ 86% are in the humanities or social sciences (21% in English or literature)
 - ➤ Only 7% are affiliated with engineering and natural science
 - 92% of boycotting English professors' research focuses on Class, Gender, Race or Empire
- Academic boycotters have brought BDS to their campuses in multiple ways:
 - > in course curricula
 - > in academic conferences
 - > on university websites
 - departmental sponsorship of BDS events
 - > in the academic senate
 - advising pro-Palestinian student groups
 - > through faculty advocacy groups

Documenting campus antisemitism

AMCHA Initiative carefully monitors media sources, social media accounts, submitted accounts, and witnessed incidents for evidence of campus antisemitism, and documents antisemitic activity on the AMCHA website, including:

- Individual Campus Monitor Pages detailing antisemitic incidents on each campus
- An interactive Academic Boycott Map detailing faculty and grad student endorsers of the academic boycott of Israel according to campus
- A Divestment Scorecard detailing divestment initiatives and outcomes
- A Student Voices section detailing student accounts of harrasment/intimidation for being Jewish or pro-Israel
- An Event documentation section detailing Jewish events purposefully interrupted by SJP


Focus on U.S. Campuses

U.S. campuses have been monitored for antisemitic activity and have digital files on AMCHA's website

Individual students are quoted in media sources tracked by AMCHA as being bullied/harassed/intimidated on campus for being Jewish or pro-Israel in 2014, spanning 24 separate U.S. campuses

Jewish events on U.S. campuses were documented by AMCHA in 2014 as purposefully being disrupted by Students for Justice in Palestine (SJP)

California Faculty Using State Resources to Promote Boycott of Israel

Concerned for the safety of San Francisco State University (SFSU) students, AMCHA Initiative released recently uncovered violent and potentially threatening Tumblr postings from SFSU student Mohammad G. Hammad to law enforcement. Hammad is also the president of the SFSU student organization, General Union of Palestine Students (CUPS). AMCHA Initiative turned over the postings and photos to San Francisco Police Chief Grea Suhr and San Francisco District Attorney George

Combating campus antisemitism

AMCHA has had notable successes in 2014 in combating campus antisemitism including:

- Strength in numbers: AMCHA established and has facilitated an at-will coalition
 of 23 civil rights, education and advocacy organizations to strategize about and
 participate in joint actions to combat campus antisemitism.
- Favorable administrator responses: AMCHA garnered the first-ever public
 acknowledgement by a top UC administrator about UC policy prohibiting
 political indoctrination in the classroom and its application to faculty. This is a
 game-changer, which will be enormously helpful in ensuring that antisemitism is
 kept out of classrooms.

Combating campus antisemitism

Some of the Incidents/Issues Addressed by AMCHA in 2014

- American Studies Association votes to boycott Israeli universities and scholars
- SFSU: Violent, antisemitic social media postings of president of General Union of Palestine Students
- UC Riverside, UC Davis, UCLA: University-sponsored events promoting the academic boycott of Israel
- CSUN: Mathematics professor uses University website to post antisemitic "Boycott Israel Resource Page"
- NYU: University-sponsored conference promoting the academic boycott of Israel
- SFSU: University-sponsored event promoting the academic boycott of Israel
- University of Arizona: The President of the Jewish fraternity was viciously beaten unconscious moments after one of the attackers raised his hand in a "heil Hitler" salute.
- UCLA: SJP launches campaign harassing students who have gone on trips to Israel sponsored by Jewish organizations
- SFSU: Professor uses University funds to travel to the Middle East and meet with individuals affiliated with terrorist organizations, for the purpose of promoting BDS
- Temple University: Jewish student punched in the face and called "baby-killer, racist, Zionist pig" and "kike" by member of SJP
- Ohio University: Student body president posted a video of herself taking the ALS Ice Bucket Challenge by pouring fake blood over herself and urging the university to boycott Israel
- SJP groups across the country: Harass, intimidate, threaten and seek to silence Jewish students
- Hundreds of Middle East studies professors sign statement calling for an academic boycott of Israel
- UCLA: Study shows Center for Near Eastern Studies sponsors egregiously anti-Israel and antisemitic public outreach events
- Hundreds of Anthropology professors sign statement calling for an academic boycott of Israel
- Binghamton University SUNY: SJP posts foundational document calling for the disruption of Jewish student event
- Wellesley College: SJP group posts antisemitic posters
- UC: Graduate student instructors union (UAW 2865) votes to join the BDS movement and individual members pledge to participate in academic boycott of Israel
- UC: Faculty use their classrooms and conference halls to promote anti-Israel propaganda and BDS

2014 Summary of Achievements

- First-ever public acknowledgement by top University of California administrator that UC policy prohibits graduate student instructors from promoting anti-Israel propaganda and BDS in their classrooms
- First-ever public acknowledgement by top University of California administrator that UC policy prohibits faculty from promoting anti-Israel propaganda and BDS in their classrooms


AMCHA Leadership



Leila Beckwith is Professor Emeritus in Pediatrics at UCLA. She gained her Ph.D. in Developmental Psychology at the University of Chicago. She then went on to teach and do research for more than 30 years at the Neuropsychiatric Institute and the Department of Pediatrics at UCLA, publishing more than 80 scientific papers. Beckwith's professional life has been devoted to the sacred mission of the university: to obey the laws of evidence and logic; to pursue the truth with integrity; to communicate it honestly to students. Beckwith is co-founder of AMCHA Initiative. She is also a board member of the California Association of Scholars and Scholars for Peace in the Middle East. In 2013 she was honored with a Hero of Conscience Award from the American Freedom Alliance.



Tammi Rossman-Benjamin is a lecturer at UCSC. Rossman-Benjamin has written numerous articles about academic anti-Zionism and antisemitism and lectured widely on the growing threat to the safety of Jewish students on college campuses. Recently she has delivered scholarly papers at Indiana University, the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Harvard University, McGill University and the Canadian Institute for Jewish Research. Rossman-Benjamin was nominated for Jewish Hero of the Year by the Jewish Federation of North America in 2011 and was named one of 2013's Bright Pro-Israel Lights on U.S. Campuses by the Jewish Press. Rossman-Benjamin is the cofounder and director of AMCHA Initiative.
