Faculty Letter Responding to President Ono and The Regents' Email "Ending the Encampment" - May 21

Dear President Ono and Regents Hubbard, Acker, Behm, Bernstein, Brown, Ilitch, Weiser, and White,

We write as faculty members at the University of Michigan. We are deeply dismayed by the violent university response to the student encampment and the central administration's misleading messages in the hours preceding and following it. At a time of democratic backsliding both domestically and around the world, universities should safeguard, not erode, the commitment to accuracy and truth. Sadly, we are witnessing systematic failures to live up to the promise and potential of a world-class university, ranging from the personal behavior and statements of central administration members to the decision to deploy university police rather than engage in meaningful dialogue. Below, we lay out basic problems in the university's actions and messages, how we got here, and possible paths forward.

In the early morning of May 21, President Ono's office released a university-wide email titled "Ending the Encampment," just after university police used a remarkable degree of violence against students. Regents took to X/Twitter in a naked attempt to whitewash, deflect from, and misrepresent these actions, reflecting a deep fear of public opinion. We are especially alarmed because, for months, the students have requested to meet with the Regents and President Ono, and instead, they have repeatedly been met with silence or force, culminating in this morning's unwarranted violence. These choices indicate not only failures of leadership, but also failures of curiosity, dedication to learning and exchange, and a sad lack of imagination, none of which inspires confidence in the institution's ability to form "leaders and best." Video footage from May 21 shows police officers in riot gear issuing an evacuation warning at dawn and engaging in force shortly

thereafter. Footage shows police officers aggressively flipping over tables and throwing chairs toward students. **Footage shows these officers, unprovoked, suddenly soaking students in pepper spray as though using a water cannon.**

The central administration has offered a series of arguments about why they chose to shut down the encampment with violence, which at their core boil down to calling students unruly, dangerous, and violent. Each of their arguments is misleading at best:

- 1. It is unreasonable to believe that it took the university nearly a month to determine that the encampment, unchanged, suddenly became a "fire hazard" despite continuous surveillance by drone, individual personnel, and a security camera. If this were indeed a concern, the university could have worked with students to address hazards. Students sleeping at the encampment would not have wished to risk a fire.
- 2. **Any fire hazard concerns were not properly communicated to students.** Every student present at the raid shared that they had not heard of any such concerns prior to the 6:50 AM email that referenced them as a justification to forcibly end the camp.
- 3. The university's definition and response to disruptive protests depends on students' racial and minority backgrounds. The university operates under a double standard that targets students of color and their allies. Just as these disruptions have had much in common with the protests by the Black Action Movement, the university has not responded with violence, threats, or intimidation to disruptions and occupations of the Diag that revolve around sports or HashBash.
- 4. The encampment replaced broken and missing bricks because this was a safety hazard. The Block M was painted with washable paint, which is no longer there. The graffiti on walkways and the Union sign came the morning after three Regents first hid from students instead of meeting with them, and after one Regent openly mocked them–just before police engaged in violence and pepper-sprayed them. While the email decries defacing property, neither police intervention nor disciplinary action resulted from a sports celebration in Jan. 2024 that caused 21 fires, including a burning couch, to mention a recent example.
- 5. If there were an assault on law enforcement officers at the UMMA, that would be a legal matter with potential charges. The university's email prejudices the matter, especially when there are clearly other ways of describing the student protest.
 Videos of the May 3 protests very clearly show police violence directed at students.

- 6. U-M's Regents are public servants. While we neither condemn nor condone protests at the places of residence of elected servants, it is important to note that such protests are neither violent nor inherently threatening. These kinds of protests are the result of elected officials' attempts to avoid engaging with their constituents.
- 7. It is surprising for the university to say there is no place for violence or intimidation when the university police and security personnel, acting on behalf of the central administration and Regents, have unnecessarily engaged in both.

Imagine how different the temperature on our campus would have been had its leaders—those elected and those appointed—simply engaged in open and regular communication with students and faculty at their institution. People protest and disrupt when their voices are not heard. Imagine how different it would have been had even one Regent invited student protesters for an open coffee hour to hear about their experiences and requests. We are embarrassed that university leadership has consistently chosen dehumanizing rhetoric and misleading messages (dating back to the very first university-wide email sent by President Ono after October 7th). We had been encouraged that the university sought to find a nonviolent solution to the challenges of the day, but we are dismayed that its leadership allowed external forces to steer us off course, callously risking student safety.

Leading up to today, Regents engaged in fabrication by claiming that no one had signed up at Regents' public meetings to speak about the topic of the encampment or the protestors' demands. Faculty, students, and alumni have regularly signed up for public comments; since the new public comment guidelines implemented in 2023, they have been rarely selected. When Regents publicly declare on social media that student protestors do not engage in this forum, they are deliberately obfuscating the many ways that students, faculty, alumni, and staff have attempted to speak with them about these topics over the past eight months. Regardless, we maintain that a 2- or even 5-minute comment in a highly moderated environment is neither dialogue nor conducive to education or understanding. Regents are public servants and ought to have open lines of communication with *all* the constituencies they serve and with the university community.

As a series of small steps toward repairing some of the massive damage you have dealt to the institution over the last eight months, we encourage you take the following steps in order to move from an adversarial to a community-based dynamic:

 Meet with the students. Invite them to present their arguments for disclosure and/or divestment to the Board of Regents. Clearly, this conversation requires a medium beyond public comment, especially given the ways access to those has been eroded.

- Commit to a process that allows students to have meaningful time and, to wit, actual dialogue with you. This process could even begin in the form of a ballot where, if a certain number of students sign on, Regents commit to discussing the students' concerns with them.
- Commit to greater transparency in university-wide communications. Regents have
 muddied the line between their roles as elected officials, administrators, political
 party members, and donors. Regent interference in university-wide
 communications has harmed relationships and trust between the university
 community and central administration; instead, it prioritizes shielding elected
 Regents from criticism and accountability. This interference is a pattern of Regents'
 overreach across multiple university Presidents' tenures.
- Launch an immediate investigation into the indiscriminate use of pepper spray and physical force by UMPD and Michigan State Police against our students.

Your actions have eroded faith in your leadership. A "Year of Democracy and Civic Engagement" can only seem hypocritical when the central administration's actions have demonstrated a set of values that are antithetical to these endeavors. Promises of "democratic engagement" and "dialogue" ring hollow when they come on the heels of police repression and a refusal to engage in conversation (and a pattern that includes shutting down student democratic elections and attempting to bypass procedures for changing university policies). Higher education is under attack. It is alarming to see the university leadership succumbing to external, McCarthyesque forces that will never be satisfied instead of standing up for the sanctity of our institutions.
